Matthew 17.14-21

Jesus Heals a Demon-Possessed Boy

When they came to the crowd, a man approached Jesus and knelt before him. "Lord, have mercy on my son," he said. "He has seizures and is suffering greatly. He often falls into the fire or into the water. I brought him to your disciples, but they could not heal him."

"You unbelieving and perverse generation," Jesus replied, "how long shall I stay with you? How long shall I put up with you? Bring the boy here to me." Jesus rebuked the demon, and it came out of the boy, and he was healed at that moment.

Then the disciples came to Jesus in private and asked, "Why couldn't we drive it out?"

He replied, "Because you have so little faith. Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you."

Message from Rev Eric Lomax


I cannot help feeling that Mental illness has become one of the most prolific issues in our society. When I was much younger, one of the phrases I often heard was 'It is all in the mind, it is not real.' Now, thankfully, we are becoming more aware that mental illness is not just a superficial factor that people need to 'get over,' rather, potentially, it can kill, it breaks relationships, it destroys families, and it can drive any one of us into addiction or dysfunction. Mental illness, at its worse is a crippling disability that prevents people from living, and diminishes their self worth.

In the Bible, there is no concept of mental illness, but we do often hear about demon possession. Here is a boy who has lost control of himself. He suffers immensely, we are told, with random seizures, and walks into fires or a pit. This boy, in his day would have been a lost cause. People would not have allowed him into their home, because if he had a demon in him, that to them was as transferable as Covid; then the last thing they would want in their home was a demon. We read of other demon possessed people in the Bible, and we know even that one of them was living amongst the gravestones, isolated, and separate from the community (Mark 14).

Message from Rev Eric Lomax continued

The disciples, in dealing with this boy, had been quite useless, and this is mentioned in an almost throw-away comment, almost like a direct complaint about their performance; 'I brought him to your disciples, but they could not heal him.'

Jesus, we know, went to the boy and healed him, as simply as that.

I think about how we should place ourselves in that narrative. These last few weeks have been nonstop. It strikes me that people have a great deal of time on their hands, and almost every moment I have stopped, day or evening, somebody has phoned, or an email or a message has pinged into one of my devices. The trouble is, that the one thing guaranteed to impact on our performance as human beings is having no head-space and no freedom of thought, creativity or ideas. When we are tired we send the wrong email to the wrong person, we bump our car because we are not concentrating, we raise our voices at the person who needs gentleness instead, we fail to see the sun behind the clouds, and even the rainbows appear drab and grey. Before us we cannot see the road ahead, but only the mountain that we have created. We find ourselves somewhere on the spectrum of mental illness, and we become actually devoid of life.

The next stage is we find ourselves isolated, because those around us have enough dealing with their own issues, without having to cope with ours. We are closer to that poor boy than we would really like to think.

Jesus comes into our story at this point. The Lord of love reaches into the heart of that boy with everything he needed at that moment, to give him healing and wholeness. Indeed, Jesus rebuked the disciples for their uselessness. It seems that their religious platitudes had served no purpose at all, but he points out that, as much as anything else, they needed to look past the boy's utter hopelessness, and see the Lord's power to mend the irreparable. Jesus said 'Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you.'

Put yourself again in the place of this boy. Whatever your needs, whatever you feel, when you have the capacity to see only the immovable mountain that you have constructed, recognise how you are loved by God, and all he asks is that you trust in him just a little, because he has the power to save.

John 12, 20-33

There were some Greek people, too, who came to Jerusalem to worship at the Passover Feast. They went to Philip. (Philip was from Bethsaida, in Galilee.) They said, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." Philip told Andrew. Then Andrew and Philip told Jesus.

Jesus said to them, "The time has come for the Son of Man to receive his glory. I tell you the truth. A grain of wheat must fall to the ground and die. Then it makes many seeds. But if it never dies, it remains only a single seed. The person who loves his life will give up true life. But the person who hates his life in this world will keep true life forever. Whoever serves me must follow me. Then my servant will be with me everywhere I am. My Father will honor anyone who serves me.

"Now I am very troubled. What should I say? Should I say, 'Father, save me from this time'? No, I came to this time so that I could suffer. Father, bring glory to your name!"

Then a voice came from heaven, "I have brought glory to it, and I will do it again."

The crowd standing there heard the voice. They said it was thunder.

But others said, "An angel has spoken to him."

Jesus said, "That voice was for you, not for me. Now is the time for the world to be judged. Now the ruler of this world will be thrown down. I will be lifted up from the earth. And when this happens, I will draw all people toward me." Jesus said this to show how he would die.

For the Children (& young at heart!)

This week we are looking at a different Bible story to the adults. You can find this story in your Bible in the book of John, chapter 12, verses 20 to 33. This is a story where Jesus speaks about his own death. Jesus often used pictures to explain things to his followers and those he was teaching. Many of those listening were farmers or fishermen and so the pictures that Jesus used often reflected this. Most seeds need to fall from the plant and be buried in the ground in order to produce new plants. Jesus knew that the time was coming when he would die and be buried. He also knew that this sacrifice would make a way for many people to discover God's love and return to relationship with him.

Activities

Jesus spoke about the wheat seeds. Why not go for a walk with your family/carers and see if you can find any seeds around you? You could also try planting some seeds from the fruit or vegetables you eat during the week e.g. tomatoes?
